GENERAL RULES

- 1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the rules in accordance with the division entered.
- Neither Windsum Enterprises Ltd., nor Country Dressage., nor the Show Committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury, loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or exhibitors.
- 3. Exhibitors and riders in the Bronze division who are not members of EC, will be permitted to exhibit with the payment of a \$45 for temporary bronze sport license. Western Dressage Riders only need be members of Horse Council.
- 4. WHIPS may be carried (maximum length 1.2 meters for horses and 1 meter for ponies).
- 5. DRESSAGE TESTS: USEF Tests 2016 will be used; copies can be obtained from the Horse Council or EC. Competitors must provide their own callers if they wish their tests called for Training through Fourth Level classes. Horse Council tests will be used for Western Dressage and copies can be obtained through Horse Council.
- 6. All horses on the grounds must be entered in the Competition. Violations reported to Equine Canada.
- 7. The horse's competition number should be prominently displayed by the horse or rider/handler at all times while on the show grounds. Numbers may be obtained from the Show Office starting at 5:00 PM, Friday, August 5th, 2016.
- 8. Absolutely No Dogs allowed on the grounds or in your car.
- 9. As a matter of courtesy and to aid in the running of the show, competitors should be aware that they may be asked to advance their showing times, with due notice.
- 10. Riders in Third and Fourth levels are allowed the option of using either a snaffle or double bridle.
- 11. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.

Entries

- 12. The Management may limit the entries and also reserves the right to split, combine, cancel and/or adjust any class at its discretion, to govern all conditions of the show, and to make decisions upon any matters not covered by current EC rules.
- 13. Entries must be received in the hands of the Entry Secretary no later than Midnight, Monday July 25th, 2016 with full payment.

 NO POST DATED CHEQUES. No telephone entries will be accepted. Post entries may be accepted if time permits. Post entries will be subject to a surcharge of \$35.00 per horse. Copies of current Horse Council Card and Equine Canada Sport License for Bronze entries for owner and rider to be provided with entry.
- 14. Dressage times may be limited. Entries received after the spaces are filled will be placed on a waiting list, even if received prior to closing date. Competitors who cannot be accommodated will be notified and all fees will be refunded after the show.
- 15. SPECIAL REQUESTS AND MULTIPLE ENTRIES: Please indicate on the entry form the order in which you wish to ride if you have multiple horses in the same class. Special requests cannot be considered after the close of entries. Once assigned, ride order will not be changed.
- 16. Any entry not properly completed or not including the required documentation or payments will be returned to the sender. No competition numbers will be issued without payment
- 17. Make cheque payable to "Country Dressage". Dishonored cheques will be subject to a \$35.00 penalty.
- 18. No entry is eligible to compete until the entry form has been signed by the person responsible (please see Glossary for definition of "Person Responsible"). A parent (or guardian) must sign for junior riders/drivers. It is the responsibility of the competition secretary to ensure that no entry competes until or unless this requirement is met.
- 19. The entry form must be signed by the person responsible who must be an EC Sport License holder. In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their child's entry form without holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rulebook. (See Article A214.2)

All entry forms must contain the following statements which must be signed by the person responsible (See Article A1011 – Person Responsible): "I hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of Equine Canada at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless EC, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives."

PERSON RESPONSIBLE: The Person Responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The Person Responsible may be the trainer or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The Person Responsible must be an adult and must hold an EC individual or group license (see A203.5)

GLOSSARY

The Person Responsible for a horse is an adult, who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. The Person Responsible must hold an EC Sport License (see A203.5). For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

Refunds

In cases of horses being entered and not exhibited, a veterinarian's certificate must be received before the start of the classes entered. Upon receipt of this certificate & form, the show committee may refund part or all of the entry fee. Other fees (stabling, administration, etc) will not be refunded. Vet services are at the owner's expense.

Stabling

- Stabling on the show grounds will be available at noon on Friday, August 5th, 2016. The Stabling Fee is \$100.00 from noon Friday until completion of the show on Sunday and includes first bedding. One day stabling available for \$40.00 per day.. Stabling fees are non-refundable once your entry has been accepted. A \$50.00 Stall Deposit is required made payable to Country Dressage, and will be returned if the stall is cleaned before you leave the show grounds.
- Competitors changing their stall assignments without the express permission of the Stable Manager will have their horses withdrawn from the competition without refund. Shavings/sawdust will be available.

ARTICLE E 4.0 SAFETY HEADGEAR All riders, regardless of age or level or competition, must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN label.
